2026 Indigenous Scholarships

Korowal School is a K-12, independent, secular, and co-educational school. Our School name, 'Korowal', is an Aboriginal word meaning 'to stand alone', or 'the strong one'.

Founded in 1978 in Leura, Korowal School was based around a human-centred philosophy. Within this, we consider that all human beings are of equal worth and capable of reason. We believe that each of us possesses a capacity to solve problems for ourselves in order to flourish. We continue to hold these as core principles today and our values are important to us. Korowal wishes to honour our First Nations People through providing access to our education in a small and nurturing environment.

The aspects of education at Korowal which attract many, include:

- Relationship-based teaching and learning
- A focus on creativity in all learning
- Forging deeper connections to Country
- Our Oracy programme which places the child's voice at the centre
- Inclusive programming and curriculum
- Small class sizes
- A beautiful, natural bush setting
- Exciting and varied co-curricular programme in high school

The Scholarship

It is our desire to share our learning environment with the wider community of the Blue Mountains. Through the enrolment of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander families at Korowal we will enrich the learning environment for all students, staff and families. It is our ideal that we would grow a stronger connection to the culture, spirit and arts of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people within our learning environment.

Korowal School welcomes applicants who model our school values to apply. We are offering the opportunity for families with children who identify as Indigenous to apply for a scholarship for enrolment in 2026. The duration of the scholarship will be from the year of entry, until the end of that stage of schooling. For example, until the end of primary or the end of secondary. If the student enters in primary school, there is the opportunity to extend the scholarship into high school after review.



Scholarship Criteria

In applying for a scholarship, please consider each of the following:

- How you model Korowal's values of kindness and respect.
- That you identify as an Indigenous Australian.
- That you have a commitment to serving your community.
- That you are willing to work in partnership, with open communication.
- How a Korowal education can make a difference to your life and your community.

Applicants are invited to submit the following parts of the application, each of which will demonstrate how they exemplify the above qualities:

PART 1. Personal Information

PART 2. School records, such as reports and NAPLAN

PART 3. Personal statement (See page 6)

PART 4. A letter of recommendation from an external community member (someone who knows your passions)

PART 5. A letter of recommendation from a teacher who knows you well

Application Process

- Parts 1-5 are to be submitted via email to <u>scholarships@korowal.nsw.edu.au</u> by Wednesday, March 12, 2025 at 5pm. We will be reviewing applications as they arrive and may be in contact with you prior to the closing date.
- 2. Applicants will then be invited to attend an interview with the Scholarship Committee.
- 3. The applications will be reviewed by the School's Scholarship Committee.
- 4. Applicants (successful and unsuccessful) will be notified following the interview.
- 5. The regular enrolment process would then proceed for the successful candidate/s. This includes interviews with the Year Mentor, Stage Advisor, or Class Teacher and completion of all enrolment paperwork, policies and procedures. The receipt of a Korowal Scholarship is dependent on completion and issue of a Letter of Offer of Enrolment.
