2027 Creative Arts Scholarships

Korowal School is an independent, secular, and co-educational school with programmes from Kindergarten to Year 12. Our School name, 'Korowal', is an Aboriginal word meaning 'to stand alone', or 'the strong one'.

Founded in 1978 in Leura, Korowal School was based around a human-centred philosophy. Within this, we consider that all human beings are of equal worth and capable of reason. We believe that each of us possesses a capacity to solve problems for ourselves in order to flourish. We continue to hold these as core principles today and our values are important to us.

Korowal School welcomes current students and new applicants who model our school values to apply. This scholarship programme aims to strengthen and enhance the creativity the school is renowned for.

Students entering Year 7, Year 8 and Year 11* in 2027 are eligible to apply. *Please note that Year 11 begins in Week 5, Term 4, 2026.

We will be offering scholarships with up to 25% fee reduction (to be determined on an individual basis).

The duration of the scholarship will typically be for three years. For example, a Year 7 scholarship will be awarded until the end of Year 9. A Year 11 scholarship will be awarded until the graduation at the end of Year 12.


Scholarship Criteria

In applying for a scholarship, applicants are expected to fulfil the following criteria:

- How they exemplify Korowal's ethos, values and practices.
- A particular creative passion and interest that they wish to pursue at Korowal.
- A commitment to contributing to their community.
- How a Korowal education can make a difference to their life and their community.

Applicants are invited to submit the following parts of the application, each of which will demonstrate how they exemplify the above qualities:

- **PART 1.** Personal Information
- **PART 2.** School records (current Korowal students do not need to submit records/reports)
- **PART 3.** Personal statement




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- **PART 4.** A letter of recommendation from an external community member (for example, dance/music teacher, someone who knows your passions).
- **PART 5.** A letter of recommendation from a teacher who knows you well.
- **PART 6.** A portfolio (4-6 pieces) of work that demonstrates your creativity or music/drama audition of 20 minutes for shortlisted candidates.

Application Process

1. Parts 1-6 are to be submitted via email to scholarships@korowal.nsw.edu.au by **Wednesday, February 18, 2026 at 5pm**. Drama/music applicants will be invited to participate in an audition for Part 6 by appointment.
2. Applicants will then be invited to attend an interview with the Scholarship Committee.
3. The applications will be reviewed by the School Executive.
4. Applicants (successful and unsuccessful) will be notified following the interview.
5. The regular enrolment process would then proceed for the successful candidate/s. This includes interviews with the Year Mentor or Stage Advisor, and completion of all enrolment paperwork, policies and procedures. The receipt of a Korowal Scholarship is dependent on completion and acceptance of the enrolment process.

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PART 6: Portfolio submission / Audition

Visual Arts Portfolio

Visual Arts applicants will need to present a portfolio containing at least four examples of artwork via email: scholarships@korowal.nsw.edu.au or to the school office by **Wednesday, February 18, 2026 at 5pm**. This may include work produced at school, at home, or at art classes, and may include 4D as well as 2D work. In addition, you may submit a Visual Diary or write a statement of up to 100 words about your interest in art.

The school will retain the artworks for 4-6 weeks after the Scholarship application deadline at which time they can be collected from the school office.

In accepting a Creative Arts Scholarship at Korowal, students are expected to take Visual Arts as an elective subject in Years 9 and 10 or Senior School (depending on the scholarship awarded) and to contribute to the artistic life of the school.

Music Audition

Short listed applicants for a Music Scholarship will be asked to attend an audition to be held at the school where they will be asked to perform before a small panel. The audition shall take approximately twenty minutes and will consist of the following sections:

1. The performance of two pieces on the student's first instrument (including voice) that are contrasting, both in mood and in period of composition. Not more than 10 minutes total. If the student has a second instrument, they may choose to play one of those pieces on that instrument instead.
2. The vocal performance of a short song of the student's choice (e.g. "Happy Birthday" or something more complicated) either unaccompanied or with backing accompaniment. This does not need to be polished, it is just to demonstrate the ability to perceive pitch. In the case of students whose first instrument is voice, they will be required to play two major scales on their second instrument.
3. Sight reading a short piece on the student's main instrument (including vocalists).
4. A few simple ear tests (similar in type in the AMEB/Trinity College exams) including rhythmic memory, simple/compound time identification, melody echo (vocal), major/minor chord identification, singing the higher or lower note of two notes played together.
5. Two major scales as follows. One of student's choice, one of the panel's choice.
 - Year 7 and 8 Scholarship: up to 3 sharps or flats
 - Year 11 Scholarship: up to 5 sharps or flats

[If the instrument is piano, these should be hands together, similar motion]



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6. A short discussion about the candidate's musical interests, what they might contribute to the school community, etc.

Equipment:

A piano, drum kit, amplifier and laptop (for mp3 playback etc) will be available for use at the audition.

Accompaniment:

Applicants should provide their own accompanist or mp3 backing track (on USB drive) as required. Please note that Staff at the school will not be available to provide accompaniment.

In accepting a Creative Arts Scholarship at Korowal, students are expected to take Music as an elective subject in Years 9 and 10 or Senior School (depending on the scholarship awarded) and to contribute to the musical life of the school and public events (School Cabaret, Korowal Fair, community events etc)

Drama Portfolio & Audition

Drama applicants will take part in a number of theatre activities / games and perform a short script that will be provided in advance. Auditions will be held by appointment.

In accepting a Creative Arts Scholarship at Korowal, students are expected to take Drama as an elective subject in Years 9 and 10 or Senior School) (depending on the year the scholarship is awarded) and to contribute to the artistic life of the school at school and public events (Drama Performances, School Cabaret, Korowal Fair, community events etc).
