
This is a temporary position for two terms, commencing Term 2, 2026 and ending Term 3, 2026.


Teachers at Korowal take care

- The implementation of syllabuses as described in the NSW Curriculum.





- A current Working with Children Check registered number.
- Experience in teaching the NSW Australian Curriculum in a primary school and understanding of regulations and legislation relevant to teaching primary students in NSW.
- Experience working as a team member in a collegiate teaching environment.
- Experience/training in an explicit approach to teaching literacy through phonics and phonemic awareness.
- Experience in teaching with project-based learning and sustainability initiatives would be an advantage.
- An ability to lead children in singing, recorder playing and reading music.
- An ability to lead children in speaking, listening and drama activities.
- An ability to draw and lead children through guided art activities.
- A willingness to uphold Korowal School's values and ethos.
